



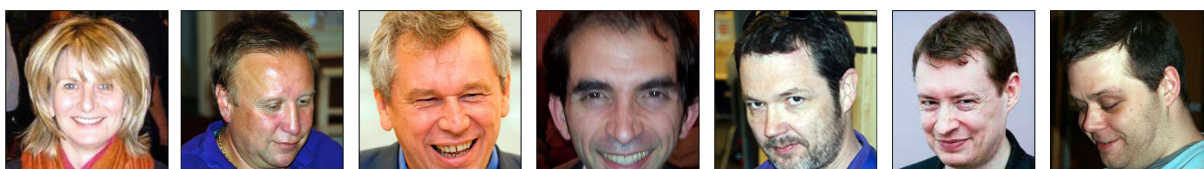

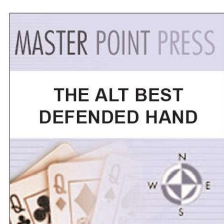
#### BATTLE OF BRITAIN

## TWO EXPENSIVE LEADS

The single most important card in the play of almost any hand is the opening lead. It often determines the fate of the final contract. Particularly against slams finding the right lead is crucial, as you usually don't get a chance to recover. Two slam lead problems occurred in the sixth edition of the Alt New Competition. See if you would have done better than our participants.

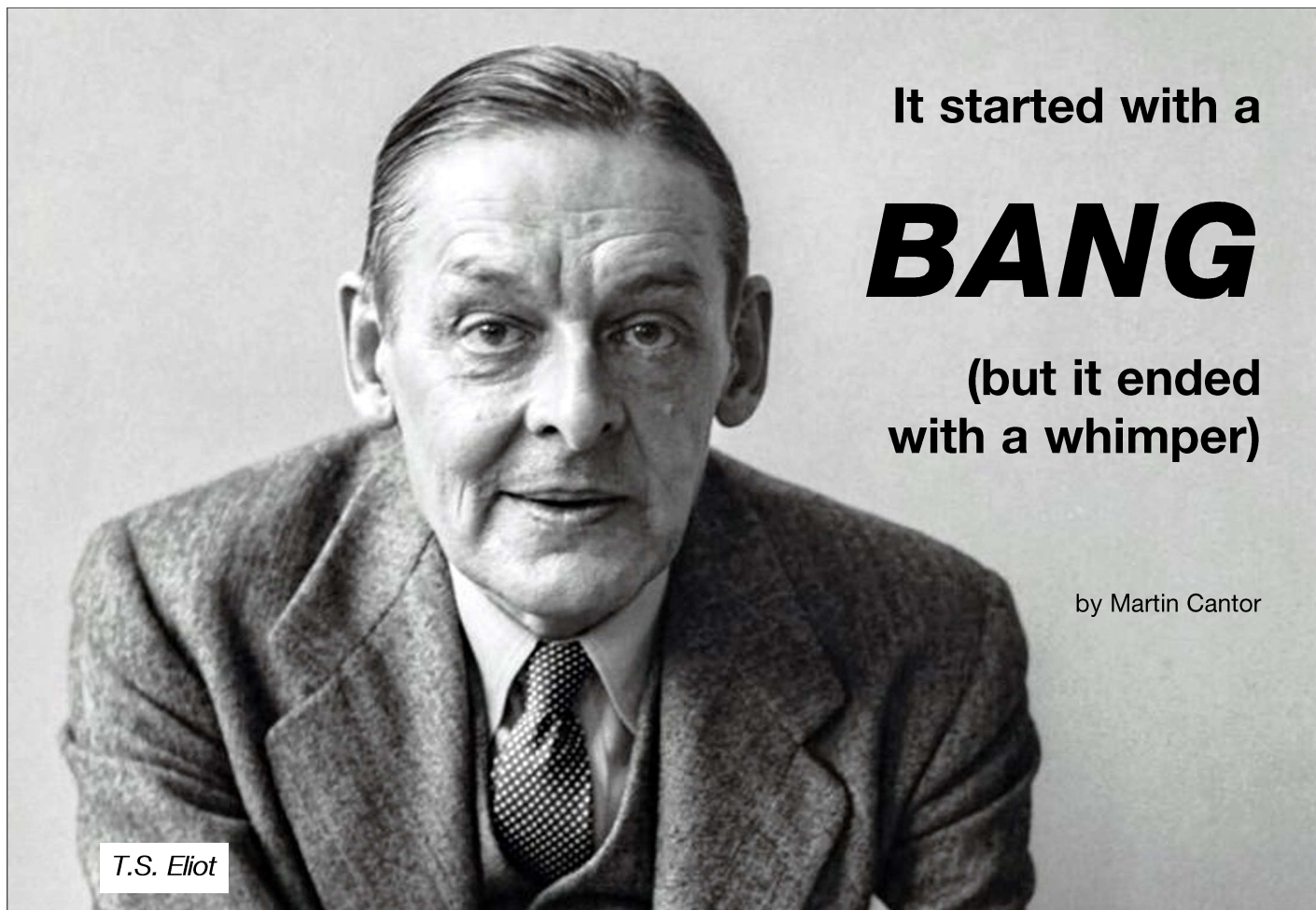

# Alt Elevator

# It started with a **BANG** (but it ended with a whimper)

I don't know whether T.S. Eliot played bridge, but if he did he'd have seen his poetry becoming prophetic in this Alt tournament. Elsewhere in this Bulletin Mark Horton reports on an explosive start to the first match. Match 3 started with an even bigger bang.

With the 3-3 heart break EW can make the 28 point small slam in either red suit, but you'd obviously prefer to be in diamonds. Making it is easy, bidding it somewhat less so. Strong 4441 hands are notoriously difficult to bid unless you are playing Precision or have this as one of your Multi options. If you don't have a

special bid available your principal options are to open one of a minor, planning to reverse into hearts; or to open 1♣, planning to reverse into diamonds; or to open one of a minor, planning to jump to 2NT over 1♠. This last option traditionally shows 18-19, so you have upgraded for your two tens and good controls, but not downgraded for the poor support for partner's suit. It was a popular choice.

There are also some bidding issues for West. Let's see first what happens if East opens 1♣ and South passes. Many nowadays play Walsh style, in which you bid a four-card major before diamonds, even if the diamonds are longer, unless you have enough to force to game. Modern openings being what they are, for me this hand wouldn't merit a game force, so it would have to be a 1♠ response even if that feels a little unnatural. But what about if East opens a minor and South overcalls 1♠, as six Souths did? If the opening was 1♣ you have an easy 2♦ - unless of course you play Negative Free Bids (yuck), when 2♦ would be non-forcing. But what if the opening was 1♦? Now 2♦ from you is presumably non-forcing, and double with only three hearts isn't ideal. Your best option is 2♠, showing an invitational hand with a diamond fit, and which might get you to what from your hand looks the likeliest resting place of either game or a partial in notrump or diamonds. Lots there for partnerships to

This time NS have the dynamite, enough for another 28 point small slam, this time in one denomination only, clubs. One pair overstretched to 7♣ (South bid it even after North denied the ♣Q); two pairs chose the no-play spade slam; eighteen played a notrump or black suit game; and just seven got to the top spot. The play is not without interest. Assuming a trump loser, there are three possible lines. You can play for one of several squeezes, with threats in all three side suits; or you can play to ruff one heart with the ♣3 and discard one on the ♠K. Or you can play to set up a long spade for a second heart discard. Which is the best line? The third, which just needs spades no worse than 4-2 and also allows you to cash the top clubs just in case the QJ fall, plus there might be some tiny residual squeeze chances. Playing to ruff a heart needs them to be 4-3, clearly worse odds than spades 3-3 or 4-2. As they lie, either major suit line works, but the squeezes don't work, as one declarer sadly discovered. Incidentally, Tom Townsend sat East and didn't have much to do other than rather trivially follow suit for six tricks until declarer claimed. But that didn't mean that his attention wandered from the cards; as the hand ended he pointed out that he had JJJJ and his partner had QQQQ. Gary Donner in South chipped in with his KKKK.

NS again, and you might say this time with gelignite since they have a massive 29 HCP. As we all know, HCP aren't everything, and with only seven-card fits the power is noticeably reduced. Still, any optimist who figured that the Alt dealing machine was in slam mode would do just fine, as long as they chose the major with the stronger holding. Because the machine was in that kind of mood, and dished the opposing spades out 3-3, for twelve tricks in hearts. When you look at the results for this board you see a whole column of 3NTs and 4NTs, broken up by just one lonely but happy 6♥, belonging to Richard Plackett and Espen Erichsen. The rose-tinted glasses award goes to Espen.

No slam available here, but things didn't exactly quieten down, with double figure swings in twelve of fourteen matches, and pride of place going to team Cantor (editor - am I allowed to say this?), for whom Tatyana Trendafilova & Fredrik Jarlvik made 5♥, and David Burn - Mike Graham at the other table made

4♠X, for a total of 16 IMPs. You might want to consider whether, third in hand, you would choose to open 1♠ or 2♠ (I presume you wouldn't pass). The field was pretty evenly divided on this question. Fifteen chose 1♠ and thirteen chose 2♠, but it's a little more nuanced than those simple figures, since of the thirteen 2♠s two were stronger than usual (9-11 & 10-13) while two others were 'weak but wide-ranging'. You might wonder which of these worked best in practice, but an examination of the results is unrevealing, with the final contract seeming to be as much a matter of style as of system or of opposition bidding. Boards 5 and 6 gave us the chance for a short breather with a couple of part scores, but then came the nitroglycerine.

North has a pretty normal weak two opening, but four Norths saw it differently. One decided that in third hand 1♥ was the right call, while three Norths got aggressive with a 3♥ opener. It didn't make any difference to the Easts, who all bar two bid the obvious 4♠ (the others doubled 2♦/2♥). If South passes West has a difficult decision whether to raise (and, if so, whether to cue bid ♦s on the way). You do hold three great cards, but you also have a lot of quick losers, and partner's bid is quite wide-range. If South raises hearts, your hand is better since partner rates to have at most one loser in the suit. But still a tough decision. Just three pairs got to the grand slam, two of them when South raised hearts via a fit-showing club bid, allowing West to get his fit-showing diamond bid in relatively cheaply.

Well done to Kelvin Ng & Kheng Hun Siew of team Lion who not only got there without that help, but also got themselves doubled into the bargain, for a score of 2470 and an 18 IMP swing against the 5♠+2 at the other table.

The match started, and continued, with a bang, or more accurately with a series of bangs, but it ended with a whimper when board 16 was a dull part score, played at the 1 or 2 levels at all except two tables.

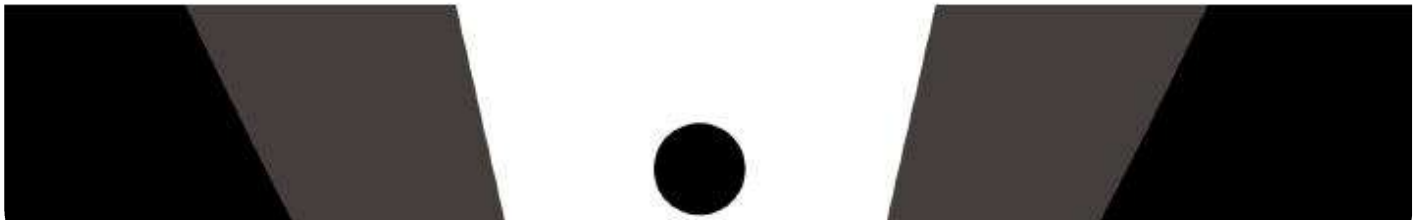
