




The editor likes us columnists to try to explain the thought processes of the players. Despite what he obviously thinks, I'm no mind-reader, but I'll do my best for you here. And I'll trust that the players will forgive me if I misrepresent their thoughts, but I like to keep the editor happy.

In the Open Room Kit Woolsev declined to overcall. presumably with an eye to the vulnerability, but maybe their style requires more at any colors. Joel Wooldridge could now show his lovely heart suit via a transfer, and David Grainger bid his fractionally less lovely spades, but at least this confirmed genuine clubs. Bart Bramley decided it was time to show some life with a double. In principle takeout I believe, even if the opponents have shown three of the four suits. Kit now jumped in hearts, and this ended the auction, to the surprise of the kibitzers, who thought Bart might raise. This was their reasoning (yes, Jan the editor, I can also read the minds of the spectators): after Joel's bid Bart knows that Kit has at most five hearts (if longer were possible he might perhaps have few values), so he either has four hearts and some more values, or five and a maximum pass.

Whatever the reasoning, they missed a vulnerable game that was comfortably bid at the other table when Mikael overcalled. North-South could have saved

profitably in 5♣ which costs 500, but maybe the twins would have gone on to 5♥ which, with everything lying so nicely, makes despite the 4-0 trump break. Kit and Bart weren't the only ones to miss game: six NS pairs stole the board in 3♣ (mostly making) and three stole it in 1♠, twice making 9 tricks. Across the ten matches 70 IMPs were swung.

Fifth deal of the match and our first potential slam. Only 25 hcp it is true, but a ten card trump fit and, if the opponents bid enough spades, you have a fair idea that you are playing with a thirty point pack. So did our victims find it, or did our other victims get in the way?

I imagine that 3 by Grainger would be natural and forcing, but peering into his mind, I see that he wanted to protect a lead through partner's supposed diamonds. The four-level transfer left no room for Wooldridge to show slam interest, even if he had wanted to, so that was the end of that. The other room got closer - with a hefty shove from the opponents.



In theory the twins made it hard by jumping a level higher and then raising, but perversely might have made it more likely. Once Owen Lien decided to bis on, might

he have done so via a 5♦ cuebid? He can reasonably expect at most a singleton spade in South. On the other hand, "when you have been preempted, stay preempted" is often good advice, and I'm sure I'm not alone in thinking I would bid 4♥ with the South hand if you replace the ♣A by the ♣J. As it transpired, only four pairs got to slam, so well done to them. Everyone else played 4 or 5♥, except for one unfortunate pair where South's 5♣ (presumably cue-)bid was passed as natural and choice of contract after North's 1♣ opener. For the record, par on the board is 6♠X for 1100, which nobody found. Also for the record, the deal generated a mere 57 IMPs.

That was the first slam of the match, but by no means the last, and towards the end we had three in a row. Which prompted me to wonder what would be an appropriate collective noun for slams. Is it a string of slams? A dunk? A squeeze? A score? A plus? A minus (that would be me)? Humorous suggestions on a postcard (OK then, email) to the editor.

Traditionally you need 37 hcp for a grand slam but 'only' 33 are enough here thanks to the long strong diamonds. You would expect everyone to get to slam, but would any or many get to the grand? Woolsey-Bramley, with their highly developed relay system within a strong club base, would be favorites to do so. Let's see.

Kit Woolsey (I.) & Bart Bramley: a worthy nomination

Beautifully done and worthy of a nomination for the Alt Bid72 Best Auction Award. The 4♥ bid told Bramley about the two missing aces, and being then able to distinguish which kings was the final piece that allowed him to bid 7NT; a bid that he might have alerted (but didn't) as "I can count 13 tricks". Except, I suppose, in the unlikely event that Kit's ♠K was doubleton - so maybe he should have asked for exact shape, if he could then subsequently still get the detailed information on controls. Meanwhile, in the other room:




The twins also had a relay auction that looked to be driving towards flattening the board, until a wheel came off when Mikael asked a question that Ola thought he had already answered. A costly error, to the tune of 17 IMPs, and Big Club, who had trailed 44-1 after 11 boards, had now scored 27 in two to close to 44-28. I've already told you that there are two more slams coming up, so we will see whether they could continue the comeback. Before we do, credit is also due to Hanlon-Garvey, the only other pair to reach the top spot, which they did after Tom Hanlon opened the West hand with a 19-20 2NT. Credit also to the three pairs who got to the diamond grand. Again for that record, 71 IMPs.

Match 3 Board 14. E / None



Slam isn't so good here, but I guess all the players have been in worse (me too). 6 is much better than 6♥. In diamonds, as long as they can't lead heart and heart ruff, you just need to bring the hearts in for one loser. Which you will do if West has the ace, or with the small additional chance of West holding the J10 stiff. So overall a little below 50%. In hearts you need to avoid an opening diamond ruff, or a diamond ruff after conceding the trump ace (what kills it here), and you still need to play hearts for one loser by playing towards the honors twice. Entries to the South hand are limited; if you ruff clubs twice you can only lead up once, losing out to Axx in West. And if you use a diamond entry you increase the chance of suffering a ruff, though as long as you do this after the club ruff entry you should be OK. Did either of our featured East-Wests find it? Short answer, no; they had identical 3♦ - P - 3NT auctions to 3NT, and both made ten on the ♣K lead. They were in good company, ten other pairs doing the same. Three played 5, one played 4♥ and four hit the jackpot of the diamond slam. Only three swings on the deal, two of ten IMPs and a single single.

This is a pretty good slam. Only 26 hcp but again the long strong diamonds give it the necessary heft. If both pointed suits break it's straightforward. If neither does you're in trouble, though some layouts have play. So what about if one breaks and one doesn't? Now spades is better. Assuming a heart lead, there is no

way back in diamonds if they don't break. In spades you can cope with a 4-1 break with a singleton jack or ten in East, as long as you play for restricted choice. Let's see how our tables did, before I tell you how the rest of the field fared.






Short and sweet - and lucky, to find the hearts 4-4. Ola led the ♣4 and Lien had all the tricks but Edmonds had 12 IMPs, pushing their lead back up to 28, and they added a further 6 on the final board for a big win. Did anyone else match Wooldridge and Grainger in finding a slam? Perhaps surprisingly, just one other pair, well done Yuri Khryuppenen & Eugene Antonov of team Russia who earned themselves the biggest swing - 13 IMPs - on the board.





IS 3NT THE MOST INTERESTING CONTRACT? Martin Cantor

The answer is often yes. Last month's Alt Elevator tournament has already produced some nominations for a Best Declarer Play Award for success in 3NT. The deal below threw up some interesting analysis in the chat between commentators and kibitzers. As it happens the contract at the Vugraph table where the chat took place was 5♣, but that is pretty routine - indeed (bizarrely) 6♣ made more than once, as did 4♥ which can also be beaten. Anyway, what about 3NT?



Notrump was played eight times, always by North. East produced a solid double when the small slam was played and quickly cashed his two aces. One played at the four level, the others in game, and they all made, sometimes with overtricks. And, played by North, 3NT can always be made. On a diamond lead it

is straightforward: you win the king, drive out the A, and have the ◆Q entry for the long clubs. On a spade lead and continuation you take the second round. drive out the A, and still have the diamond entry. A spade lead and heart switch, as happened at a few tables, gets you overtricks on the same line. But what about a spade lead, overtaken by West, and a diamond switch. If you play low on this from North, East ducks, and your entry to the clubs is dead. But there is a classic counter move: you put up the ◆K, and East is helpless. If he ducks you are in clover. If he wins the ace and returns the jack you take the queen, dropping West's 9, and unblock the 8 in hand to leave the •7 high in dummy as your entry. If East wins the ace and returns a small diamond you duck to West's 9, and he has no further diamonds to play so your entry is secure - as long as you take the ace if West next plays a small spade.

Played by South, however, there is a defense, even if not an easy one to find. Firstly, West has to ignore his spades and lead a diamond. This looks like the same position we had earlier, in which declarer can put up the king to preserve his entry. But no. If he puts up the king East wins the ace and plays a small diamond back. Declarer has to duck this to West, who now plays a small spade. If declarer ducks, East wins the 10 and clears the diamonds while he still has the ♣A. And of course if declarer wins the first spade the suit is ready for West to cash when his partner gets in with the club. Such a shame that no EW pair had the chance to find this defense to get nominated for the Best Defense Award.

North led the ♥4 and declarer won with dummy's jack and ran the AQ, North winning with the king and exiting with the \$3. Declarer won with dummy's ace and played a spade to the nine which saw North win and play a second diamond. South won with the king and continued with the jack, declarer ruffing with the ♠10, drawing the outstanding trump and claiming the rest, -100.

It seems petty to point out that if South returns a heart North can ruff for an extra undertrick.

Another point worth making is that starting spades by leading the gueen might be unlucky if South has a singleton king. Low to the nine gives you a 74% chance of losing only one trick.

As we have seen, if South starts with a passive club or a trump declarer can get up to 12 tricks, and the same is true if South leads a heart. The one lead to guarantee the demise of the contract is a diamond and Gunnar Halberg was up to the task, clicking on the ◆6. Declarer won with the ace and tried to cash three rounds of hearts, but North ruffed the second and played a diamond, -100 and 11 IMPs.

In general terms, if your opponents reach a suit contract where you have a promising trump holding leading from a short suit may not be the best way to protect it - making a lead that suggests length in a suit will probably be a better idea. If you suspect/hope that partner has useful trumps, then leading as if you have a short suit might be a good idea.

North led the ♣2 and declarer won with the ace, cashed the ♠K and played a spade to dummy's queen, South discarding the ♥5. Declarer drew the outstanding trump and played a club, North throwing the ♥Q. Dummy's top clubs took care of the ◆8 and on the second of these North discarded the ♥3. Now declarer could play a heart towards the king and eventually establish a second heart trick, +1430.

North led the \$2 and declarer won with the ace, cashed the king and then overtook the jack with dummy's queen to play the ♥8, South fatally discarding the \$8. South withheld the ♥A but it did not help, declarer winning with the king and playing two rounds of clubs, claiming when North discarded the ♥3, +1370.

In the match between the Jedi Knights and Black both East's responded 4♠ to West's 1♠. Andrew Black advanced to 6♠ while Patrick Shields passed. North led the ♥Q in both rooms and declarer could ruff two hearts in dummy for an easy +1430 and 13 IMPs.

Fredin also gained 13 IMPs against Salvo when the ♥Q was led against the auction 1♣-3♣-6♣-6♠ but Klukowski went down when Mak led the ♣2 in the match between Edmonds and Mostly Amateurs and then hung on to enough hearts, the same thing happening to Adriano Rodrigues in the match between Mixed Nuts and Tilly, Greg Hinze being the defender occupying the North seat. They both collected 13 IMPs.

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


Bilde's Big Board

It seldom happens that Agustin Madala goes down in a contract made at the other table. Italy v Denmark (Juniors, Round 14) was an exception.

Board 18. Dealer East. N/S Vul.



After West had shown a two-suiter in the majors, Madala as South played 3NT. When West led the eight of spades, declarer overtook East's nine with the queen. Coming in with the ace of diamonds, East played through South's spades and the contract went down one. Of course, declarer had pinned his hopes on West having the diamond ace. Not so.

When East kicked off with the nine of spades, declarer decided to play low from dummy! West overtook the ten and switched to his stiff diamond. East won the ace and returned a heart to the king. Dennis Bilde played a spade himself to cut communications in defence. West took the king and played a heart back to dummy's ace. Declarer took the club finesse, played king and another diamond, and claimed the balance for nine tricks. Cool.

Post Mortem (2011)

- 1. The double of 3NT disclosed the all important position of the diamond ace, which explains Bilde's unusual duck at trick one.
- 2. Double-dummy defence could prevail by leading or switching to clubs.
- 3. Denmark won by 17-13 which may be of interest in the race for medals.
- 4. The name Bilde is big in Danish bridge. Dennis's sister Majka is here as a player in the Youngsters section and father Morten, a former member of the Danish Open team, is the coach of the Danish Juniors.

Post Mortem (2021)

- 1. Dennis Bilde (1989) nowadays plays for the Danish Open Team with Emil Jepsen.
- 2. In the American Nationals Dennis's regular partner is Agustin Madala ('If you can't beat him, join him!').


Bilde's Big Board, Ten Years

Exactly ten years after the Albena Big Board Dennis Bilde decided that it was about time to produce another Big Board.

Wednesday, August 11th, 2021, 20.17 hrs CET. ALT NewCo 7. Round 7. Fredin v Lebowitz.



Looking at the North-South cards the slam more or less depends on the heart finesse. 4 spades, 4 diamonds, 2 hearts and 2 clubs makes 12. The good news was that the ♥K was on side. The bad news however was the bad break in spades. Pretty hopeles, right? Well, we will see.

East led a spade to king and ace. West returned the ♣8. North won and tabled the ♥J, which kept the trick (East did not cover). Declarer cashed a couple of tricks

and discovered the bad break in spades in the process. But Dennis Bilde grabbed his chance in this position:



He advanced the ◆K and East, who had to sit on his hearts, pitched a club and from dummy disappeared the ▼6. When Dennis Bilde continued with a heart to the ace, west was forced to bare his ♣Q. The last two tricks where ♣K and 10. Job done.

True, East could have killed communications (and the slam) if he had covered the ♥J. But in a very early stage that was extremely difficult to see. Still, the hand certainly nominates for the *ALT BeBridge Best Played Hand Award*. Afterall a slam made on a non-simultanious double squeeze is not a walk in the park.

The slam delivered Lebowitz and Co.12 IMPs as it was not bid at the other table. Dennis Bilde was the only player who bid and made 6NT. The slam went down at three other tables because East did in fact cover the \P Q (or jack).



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In Hindsight

Obviously EW missed topspot: 7♥.

Over 3 West may consider 5.
Exclusion Blackwood. After East's 5., one useful ace, West could make a grand slam try with 6.
Now the pressure is on East. If he realizes that his partner's trumps should be rock solid, he has the values to bid the grand in hearts (NoTrump would too much to be asked for).




This is what happened in the match between the Lebowitz team and Salvo:



East indeed led the ♠K and now the odds were in favour of Salvo star Nafiz Zorlu. Still the hand required careful play. North won the ♠A, crossed to dummy with ♠A and pitched his stiff club on the ♠Q. Zorlu exited with a diamond. West won and tabled a club.



From here declarer started a cross-ruff reaching this position:



Zorlu ruffed his last diamond with dummy's ♥A. That was his nineth trick. With the ♥Q still to come Nafiz Zorlo scored +590. Together with EW +430 in 3NT this added up to a juicy 14 IMPs in favour of Salvo.

At the end of the day the Turks won the ALT NewCo 7 by a lanslide.

One of the (many) factors that influence one's development as a player is that of listening to the advice of experts. When I was cutting my teeth back in the 1980s I recall Tony Forrester, one of England's greatest ever players, pointing out that when you are playing in 3NT you should remember that although it is a race between declarer and the defenders, it does not matter when you take your tricks, as long as the final total is nine. This deal from round 10 of the ALT Elevator, as played last month, is a perfect example:

West led the ♠K and when East followed with the eight she switched to the ♥6. Declarer won with dummy's

ace and played a club, East taking the ace and returning a spade for the nine and ten, declarer pitching a diamond from dummy. West exited with the ♥5 and declarer won in dummy, played a club to the ten and cashed the king. West was down to ♠Q10 ♥J8 ♠Q53 and had to part with a diamond. Declarer cashed the two top diamonds and then played the ♥10 for the jack and queen. He exited with the ♥3 and West had to win with the eight and concede the game going tricks to the ♠AJ.
